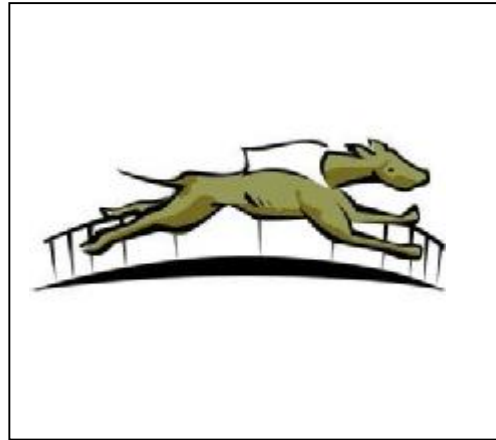

GENERAL RULES

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HERewith WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT WSH/USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH EXHIBITOR TO BECOME FAMILIAR WITH THE RULES BEFORE ENTERING THE SHOW RING.

AGE: The age of an individual on December 1, 2009 is maintained the entire year. For horse show purposes, a horse has become one (1) year old on January following the actual foaling date.

AMATEUR CLASSES: To enter classes for Amateurs, WSH Horse Shows accept WSH Amateur Cards, USEF Amateur Cards, Appaloosa Non Pro, AQHA Non Pro and Paint Non Pro Cards. WSH Amateur Card Fees are: \$15 for non-members, \$12 for WSH not competing in the WSH High Point Awards, Free to WSH members participating in at least two WSH High Point Awards. (Does not include Zone Awards competition.) Please include a copy of your card with your entry or be prepared to present it at the show office for inspection. Entry into Amateur designated classes cannot be accepted without verification, either by copy or physical inspection, or with an application on file. Exhibitors who do not include a copy with their entry and are unable to show their card at the office may file an Affidavit and pay a \$3.00 non-refundable filing fee for each affidavit submitted.

AWARDS: Crystal and ribbon to first place under the call judge. Trophy and ribbon to first place under the second judge will be awarded. Ribbons awarded from 1st to 5th Place in all classes.

BREED CLASSES: Registration number and full registered name (and show name if different) are required for entry in classes for registered horses. Registration is not required for All Other Breeds classes. Please submit a copy with your entry or be prepared to present them at the show office. Horses with multiple registrations need to submit or be prepared to present papers from all registries. Entries into Breed classes cannot be accepted without verification of breed registration.

CAMPING/PARKING: Camper and trailer parking will be available in designated areas. Electrical hookups are available at \$35.00 for the weekend; limited water hookups are available. Dry Camping (\$20/weekend) includes tents, trailers, campers, and the like that are not hooked up but used for overnight stays. Anyone camping must possess a camping pass or obtain one from the show secretary. If a camping pass is not obtained, you will be asked to leave the grounds immediately.

CHANGES: Show management may combine classes if there are fewer than three (3) entries. Exhibitors will be notified if classes are combined or cancelled. Classes with three (Walk/Trot, Leadline, & Driving two) entries on the books count for points if only two show. All Other Breeds, Trail in Hand, Saddle Seat classes & Novice Specs No WSH or Zone Points

CHECK POLICY: Open checks are a courtesy for exhibitors wishing to add additional classes during the show with the understanding that classes once entered will be charged, and that missed or scratched classes will be not be deducted from the amount owing. Open checks will not be accepted with original entries. Full payment for classes entered and stall/office fees must accompany all entries. Exhibitors wishing to add classes during the show may leave an open check (separate from their original entry fees) at the show office. Scratched classes will not be deducted from applicable fees. Checks returned for any reason will be assessed a \$50.00 processing fee.

COLOR CLASSES: Open to horses not entered in Non-Color. Horse must show a recognizable coat and/or color pattern (i.e. – Appaloosa, Buckskin, Dun, Grulla, Paint, Palomino, and Pinto). Colorful qualities considered 40% of the total judging criteria.

CONDUCT: Show management reserves the right to reject the entry of any exhibitor, or the participation of any agent/trainer/rider that has shown an objectionable attitude toward a Recognized Show Official or exhibited unsportsmanlike behavior at a previous recognized show or to that shows Management.

DOGS must be on a leash at all times. No dogs will be allowed in the Exposition Building or warm-up arena (except during the dog race).

ENTRY CLOSING DATE: September 7, 2010. Post entries accepted after this date at a flat fee of \$15 per horse.

ENTRY FORMS must be typed or printed clearly and signed by the owner or authorized agent, the rider/driver/handler (non owner) and coach/trainer. A parent or guardian signature is required if the rider/driver/handler is a Junior Exhibitor. Exhibitor numbers will not be released until all required parties have signed the entry form. Failure by any party to sign the entry form will constitute a fine of \$50 (per WSH rules). No entries will be accepted over the phone. Entries will not be accepted without payment of all class, office, post entry (if applicable) and stall fees. No open checks accepted with initial entry. Open checks are a courtesy for exhibitors wishing to add additional classes during the show with the understanding that classes once entered will be charged, and that missed or scratched classes will be not be deducted from the amount owing. Please include copies of your 1) WSH Membership Card, 2) WSH or USAE Amateur Card if entering Amateur designated classes, and 3) horse's registration papers if entering Breed classes.

ENTRY FEES are non-refundable for missed or scratched classes and will not be deducted from amounts owing on Open Checks. Exhibitors will be allowed to transfer entry fees from one class to another provided the trade is submitted to the show office on the appropriate form at least three classes prior to the first class being traded.

ENGLISH DIVISION: Classes limited to junior exhibitors are restricted to mares and geldings. Horses being shown in hunt tack and attire, refer to the Hunter Division of the USEF Rule Book for tack and attire specifications. Unless specified otherwise, acceptable bits for classes in this division include the following: regulation snaffles, including twisted wire snaffle, curbs, pelhams (including Kimberwicks), and full bridles. Prohibited are gag bits, mechanical hackamores or flat polo mouthpieces.

EQUITATION DIVISION: Horses may be of any breed or combination of breeds. Junior horses, five (5) and under may use snaffles and bosals. Junior exhibitors are limited to mares and geldings. Senior amateurs may ride stallions.

GATE HOLDS for tack/attire changes are to be requested at the show office prior to the start of the class. Gate holds are limited to a maximum of three minutes and are granted when horse and/or rider are in consecutive classes. In classes where horses compete collectively, the in-gate will not be closed any sooner than two minutes after the last horse exits the ring from the previous class, unless all entries for the next class are present. No horse will be allowed to enter the ring once the gate is closed.

GREEN HORSE: (1st & 2nd Year) Horses in their first or second year of showing in USEF/CEW/WSH and/or Breed Assn. Recognized Shows. English or Western Pleasure Division Rules apply regarding tack and attire except horses of any age entered in the Western class may be shown in a standard rawhide hackamore or ring snaffle (two hands permitted), or any standard Western curb bit (one hand only).

HIGH POINT AWARDS: Award & Ribbon to Winner. All exhibitors entered in the show will have points counted from all designated point earning classes. Horses must be entered in at least one **Breed** class for points to be counted for Breed High Point Awards. In case of a tie, winner will be the entry with the fewest classes. Points will be counted as follows:

2-8 Class Entries: 6-5-4-3-2-1

9-16 Class Entries: 7-6-5-4-3-2

17-26 Class Entries: 8-7-6-5-4-3

27 or more Class Entries: 9-8-7-6-5-4

HUNTER DIVISION: Junior Exhibitor Classes are limited to mares and geldings. Acceptable bits for hunter classes in this division include regulation snaffles (including twisted wire), pelhams (including Kimberwicks) and full bridles. The following are prohibited: gag bits, mechanical hackamores and flat polo mouthpieces. Attire and tack to be in accordance with USEF Hunter Division rules

JUDGE: The decision of the Judge is final. No one shall approach the Judge with regard to a decision unless he/she first obtains permission from the Show Committee or the Steward who shall arrange an appointment with the Judge at a proper time and place.

JUNIOR HORSES: Five (5) years old & under (foaled in/after 2005)

LIMIT HORSE CLASSES: Open to horses that have not won six (6) first place ribbons from closing date of entries at USEF, CEF, WSH, or BREED APPROVED SHOWS.

LOSS AND INJURY: I AGREE in consideration for my participation in this Competition to the following: I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse as a rider, driver, handler, lessee owner, agent, coach/trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm"). I AGREE to release Washington State Horsemen and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of Washington State Horsemen or the Competition. I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of Washington State Horsemen or the Competition. I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) Washington State Horsemen and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse at the Competition. I have read the Washington State Horsemen rules about protective equipment, and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that Washington State Horsemen strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that protective equipment cannot guard against all injuries. If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and AGREE to all of the above provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this release on the child's behalf. I AGREE that Washington State Horsemen and "Competition" as used above includes all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers, and affiliated organizations. The construction or application of Washington State Horsemen rules is governed by the laws of the state of Washington.

NON-COLOR CLASSES: Open to horses not entered in a Color Class.

NOVICE HORSE CLASSES: Open to horses that have not won three (3) first place ribbons prior to the current year in WSH or Breed shows.

NUMBERS: A permanent WSH number is issued to all exhibitors signed up in the High Point Program and that number will be worn by the exhibitor at all WSH approved shows. Exhibitor's numbers must be worn on the back with pins or yarn ties, or on each side of the saddle pad, with exception to any "in hand class" where the number can be pinned to the front of the exhibitor. Drivers may display their exhibitor number on the vehicle. **COMPETITORS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED IF THE NUMBER IS NOT IN PLACE.**

OFFICE FEE: \$15 per entry (horse & rider combination). Leadline and Walk-Trot 10 & Under entries will not be charged the Office Fee.

OPEN HORSES: No restrictions as to breed, horse or rider's age or accomplishments.

OTHER THAN HUNTER TYPE: No forward seat saddles and/or hunt attire. Roached manes and set or gingered tails are prohibited. Horses are to be shown according to breed type and carry a pleasure foot in accordance with breed specifications.

POST ENTRIES: A flat fee of \$15.00 per horse will be charged on entries not received/postmarked by the entry closing date. Leadline and Walk/Trot entries will not be charged the Office Fee or the Post Entry Fee. Entries will be accepted at the show until five classes prior to the class being entered.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: Leadline Riders must wear ASTM/SEI approved Helmet. All junior riders in Hunter and/or Jumper Classes and Hunter Seat Equitation/Pleasure classes must wear protective headgear while riding in the designated schooling, exercise areas and show ring. Harnesses must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parents, guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, is properly fitted and in good condition. The WSH, Show Committee and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance.

PROTESTS must be made in writing, signed by the protestor, accompanied with a \$50 deposit, and addressed to the Secretary of the competition within 48 hours of the alleged violation; OR may be made directly to the WSH Horse Show Director, accompanied by the \$50 deposit, and received within five (5) business days following the last day of competition.

REFUND OF ENTRY FEES: Exhibitors canceling entries after closing date of entries shall forfeit their entry fee except in case of disability of horse. Entry Fees will be refunded at 50% only upon presentation to the Show Secretary a certificate of disability from a qualified veterinarian prior to the first class the horse is entered. Stall/office fees will not be refunded for any reason. Entry fees for missed or scratched classes will not be refunded or deducted from the amount owing.

Rookie Rider – Open to rider who have not won six firsts in any show (Novice Classes not to be counted) in that particular seat or class at any show including WSH/Breed/USEF/Equine Canada. Schooling & 4-H Shows are exempt. Prior wins of horse with different rider are not a factor.

SENIOR HORSES: Six (6) years old & over (foaled in/before 2004)

STABLING: Stalls and tack rooms are \$40 each for the weekend. Stalls must be pre-paid and are non-refundable for any reason. All horses using a stall on the grounds or staying overnight must pay a stall fee. Stalls are available after 1 pm on the afternoon preceding the horse show and through the close of the show, unless special arrangements are made with the Show Manager or Show Chairman. Stalls will be assigned on a first come first serve basis; **one horse only per stall**. Mares with suckling foals excluded. Stalls will be bedded, additional pine shavings are available for purchase. NO CHANGE OF ASSIGNED STALLS PERMITTED WITHOUT PRIOR PERMISSION FROM THE SHOW MANAGER. Individuals wishing to stable together must submit their entries together in the same envelope and state such on their entry forms.

WESTERN DIVISION: Classes for Junior Exhibitors are limited to mares and geldings. Entries may be any height and may be shown by riders of any age. Horses five (5) years and under may be shown in any class in a snaffle or hackamore and may be ridden with two hands. Chaps are optional. Long-sleeve shirt with collar required, acceptable neckwear optional. Any type of spur is allowed.

WSH MEMBERSHIP CARDS: Please include a copy of your membership card with your entry or be prepared to present it at the show office for inspection. WSH members who fail to submit a copy of their current membership card with their entry or are unable to present their card to the show office will be required to file an affidavit attesting to membership together with a \$3.00 non-refundable filing fee.

WSH NON-MEMBER FEE: An exhibitor, horse owner or equitation rider who is not a WSH member, must pay a \$3.00 non-member registration fee. A horse owner who enters equitation classes will pay only one fee. Non-owner equitation riders are required to pay an additional WSH fee.

*****Any question or dispute arise not provided for in the rules herein shall be referred to the Horse Show Committee whose decision shall be final?*****

MACMURDO PERPETUAL TROPHIES

The Eddie MacMurdo Memorial High Point Horse and High Point Exhibitor awards are perpetual trophies and must be returned to the Walla Walla Valley Horseman show committee 30 days before the next year's show. In the event of a tie, each exhibitor will keep the trophy for half of the year. It is the responsibility of the winner to have the next blank plate or line engraved with their information in the same style as previous winners. Winner will be presented a keeper trophy as their permanent trophy.

Eddie MacMurdo Memorial High Point Horse

To be awarded to the horse accumulating the most points in classes throughout the show. Equitation, Jack Benny, leadline, walk/trot, 10 & under points and trail will not count for this award, but for the rider only. Novice, Limit, and Green Horse Classes do not qualify for this award. Points for this award will be compiled on a one horse/one rider combination.

High Point Exhibitors *Junior exhibitor (17 Years & Under) *Senior Exhibitor (18-38 Years) *Senior Exhibitor (39 Years & Over)

Three different age group awards will be presented to the exhibitor in each group who accumulates the most points throughout the show. Novice, Limit, and Green Horse Classes do not qualify for this award. Points for High Point Exhibitor Perpetual Trophies will be compiled on a one horse/one rider combination. Riders may show more than one horse, however, you must declare which horse/rider combination.

Breed High Point Awards

To be awarded to the Appaloosa, Arabian/Half-Arabian, Morgan, Paint Horse, Quarter Horse, & Miniature Horse that accumulates the most points in the show excluding equitation, leadline, walk/trot, Jack Benny, and trail. Novice, Limit, and Green Horse Classes do not qualify for this award. Horses must be entered and shown in one breed specific class to qualify for the breed high points.

High Point Driving Horse

To be awarded to the horse/driver combination accumulating the most points in driving classes throughout the show. The following classes count: 41, 51, 67 & 68.

High Point English Horse

To be awarded to the horse/rider combination, 17 Years & Under and 18 Years & Over, accumulating the most points in English classes throughout the show. Equitation, lead-line, Jack Benny, and trail points will not count. Novice, Limit, and Green Horse Classes do not qualify for this award.

High Point Western Horse

To be awarded to the horse/rider combination, 17 Years & Under and 18 Years & Over, accumulating the most points in Western classes throughout the show. Equitation, lead-line, walk/trot, walk/jog, Jack Benny, and trail points will not count. Novice, Limit, and Green Horse Classes do not qualify for this award.

*** All high point awards will be calculated using the Washington State Horseman High Point System which is based on the number of horses entered and the placement in each class.*

MacMurdo Calcutta Auction Event

Western Pleasure Horse, Open Class #42

Saturday night will include with a live Calcutta Auctions of the riders in the Western Pleasure Horse, Open Class #42. All exhibitors in this class need to be present for the Bidding Event. Funds for the Calcutta Auction purchases are required immediately to the Auction Secretary. The Calcutta will pay out to the winning bidders the 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place horses in the class. Proceeds will be split 30% to WWWHA and 70% divided between Calcutta winning bidders. Winning bidders will receive pay-outs of: 1st place 50%, 2nd place 30%, 3rd place 20%. There must be at least five riders in the class to hold an auction.

Specifications - Eddie MacMurdo Memorial Horse Show

(No WSH or Zone Points for these classes)

Class 10 - Morgan Horse Pleasure Driving - To be shown to an appropriate vehicle at a walk, pleasure trot and road trot. Horses must stand quietly and back readily. To be judged on manners, performance with proper cadence and balance and gait 60%; type and conformation 40%.

Class 12 & 47 - Walk/Trot English Pleasure Open - To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and trot/intermediate gait. Judged on performance. English tack (hunt or saddle seat) required. Personal appointments not considered in judging.

Class 26 & 69 - Walk/Jog Western Pleasure Open - To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and trot/intermediate gait. Judged on performance. Western tack required. Personal appointments not considered in judging.

Class 45 - Open Costume Class - Open to all exhibitors. Be creative. Winner will be chosen by help of spectator applause. Class participants are encouraged to furnish gatekeeper with a 3x5 card that provides the costume description and theme.
